My responsibilities as a consultant for the last 21 years includes all aspects of ear, nose and throat surgery. In otology, I am able to carry out all types of middle ear and mastoid surgery, such as: myringoplasties, ossiculoplasty, modified radical mastoidectomy, stapedectomy, removal of exostoses and meatoplasty.

In rhinology I am able to perform endoscopic sinus surgery, external fronto-ethmoidectomies and rhinoplasty procedures.

For the first 15 years of my consultancy my main interest was in Head and Neck Cancer surgery. I had set up a Head and Neck Cancer tertiary referral unit at Eastbourne District General Hospital. I run a head and neck cancer clinic at Eastbourne as well as Hastings, and I was responsible for looking after the local population as far as head and neck cancer is concerned (500,000 people). I carried out all aspects of head and neck cancer surgery, including: laryngectomy, neck dissection, pharyngectomy, glossectomy, lateral rhinotomy, cranio-facial resection, mandibulectomy, parotidectomy, thyroidectomy, reconstruction (local/distal flaps).

Since the centralisation of cancer services in the last 5 years, I ceased looking after Head and Neck Cancer patients, although I continued with the diagnosis of cancer patients.

Apart from continuing with all aspects of Otology and Rhinology, I also do a large number of Thyroidectomies (75 per year) and all the Parotidectomies and Pharyngeal pouches of our Trust

## **CLINICAL EXPERIENCE**

I was first introduced to Otolaryngology during a 3 month pre-registration house-officer attachment at St George's Hospital, London (Mr B Pickard, Mr D Whittam) where I performed several tonsillectomies and minor ear and nasal operations, including five tracheostomies.

I had also assisted in several head and neck cancer major procedures. This experience initiated my interest in head and neck cancer and was ultimately responsible for my undertaking an otolaryngological career.

## **GENERAL EXPERIENCE**

My general surgical experience was gained at St George's Hospital (Mr Rosswick) and The Royal Marsden Hospital, Sutton (Mr Gazet and Dr Ford). Both were busy units and I was allowed to do a wide range of operations. At Sutton, I was responsible for oncology and radiotherapy patients and I was fortunate enough in obtaining experience in the management of pain and in the care of the dying patient.

Additional non-otolaryngological surgical experience as an SHO in neurosurgery at Charing Cross Hospital (Mr Illingworth, Mr Rice-Edwards), allowed me to see several otological and rhinological brain abscesses and the otological consequences of skull fractures. I also assisted at major neuro-surgical procedures including removal of acoustics neuromas. However, the main benefit I gained during this attachment was the loss of my fear towards dura mater which has been invaluable during my otolaryngological surgical career.

## **SHO/ REGISTRAR ENT EXPERIENCE**

I worked for 18 months as an ENT SHO at St George's Hospital (Mr Pickard, Mr Whittam) and at the Royal National Throat, Nose and Ear Hospital (Mr Bailey, Mr Shah, Mr Bull, Mr Cheeseman) progressing to myringoplasties, septoplasties and tracheostomies etc, before being appointed to the ENT Unit at Plymouth General Hospital (Mr Donovan, Mr Bridger, Mr Windle-Taylor) as a Registrar. This was a very busy unit and as the only Registrar there I gained an enormous surgical experience in all aspects of otolaryngology. At the end of my three and a half years, I was able to do mastoidectomy procedures and laryngectomies unsupervised. Despite Plymouth General Hospital being a non-teaching hospital, I was able to write and publish 12 articles and performed several research projects.

After Plymouth, I was invited to apply for the ENT Registrar post at the Professional Unit at The Royal Liverpool Hospital (Professor Stell). At this very busy Head and Neck Regional Unit I gained enormous experience in the surgical management of head and neck cancer, including total laryngectomies, commando procedures, maxillectomies, total pharyngo-laryngectomies, craniofacial resections, parotidectomies, thyroidectomies and the use of rotation and microvascular flaps in reconstruction. It was a very rewarding year as I was also able to extend my otology experience by performing 10 stapedectomies and many other major ear procedures.

## **SENIOR REGISTRAR TRAINING**

During my current Senior Registrar rotation, I have added to my range of surgical experience in both the otological, rhinological and the oncological surgical spheres. While at Dudley Road Hospital I extended my head and neck experience, but it was here that I learned to perform rhinoplasties (by Mr Robin) and complicated otological procedures, such as saccus decompressions, labyrinthectomies, stapedectomies and trans-labyrinthine exposure of the IAM (also by Mr Robin). While at Dudley Road Hospital, I was encouraged to go on the Combined Universities Otology Course (Birmingham) and to visit Dr J B Causse at Bezier, France (via a TWJ Travelling Fellowship).

Whilst at the Queen Elizabeth's Hospital, Birmingham, I was able to participate fully in the specialised otological fields of cochlear implants and bone anchored hearing aid provision, both rapidly developing fields within otology. Under the supervision of Mr Johnson I have participated (assisted or performed whole procedure) in 12 trans-ethmoidal hypophysectomies and again performed many head and neck procedures under the supervision of Dr Das-Gupta and Mr Watkinson. Here I also gained valuable experience in the field of facial cutaneous malignancies and began training in functional endoscopic sinus surgery.

Whilst at the Birmingham Children's Hospital (and also at the Alder Hey Children's Hospital, Liverpool, as a Registrar) I gained essential practical experience in paediatric otolaryngology, including assessment of the paediatric larynx and the management of the airway.

## **EXPERIENCE ABROAD**

As a Senior Registrar, I was able to spend 12 months at Brisbane, Australia, as a Fellow in Head and Neck Surgery. During this attachment I performed 55 neck dissections, 50 oral/oropharyngeal major resections, 20 laryngectomies/pharyngolaryngectomies etc. I gained excellent training in FESS (30 procedures). I also performed 12 stapedectomies and 25 rhinoplastic procedures. I have also gained considerable experience in reconstruction head and neck surgery, including rotation flaps and microvascular surgery.

A new technique that I learned in Brisbane, is the medialisation of a paralysed vocal cord using silastic implants.



## **CLINICAL EXPERTISE AS A CONSULTANT**

I was appointed as a consultant in ENT and Head and Neck Cancer Surgery in 1995 at the East Sussex Hospitals NHS Trust (Eastbourne and Conquest Hospitals). I have been an Honorary Consultant Head and Neck Cancer Surgeon at the Royal Brighton University Hospitals since 2007.

I am an expert in all aspects of ENT surgery with a particular interest in Head and Neck Cancer Surgery. I have a huge referral base and look after at least ½ million population in East Sussex, UK. My surgical expertise is very wide and I can perform all types of procedure in:

## **MANAGEMENT EXPERIENCE**

As a Registrar in Plymouth I began my managerial experience by planning and managing my own outpatient clinics (under consultant supervision) and my own operating list. These opportunities have amply demonstrated the need for careful and efficient management of both operating theatre time and outpatient throughput.

In addition to the routine managerial requirements of all senior registrars, e.g. rotas, arranging operating lists, supervision of other junior doctors, I have been responsible for the organisation and funding of a series of post graduate ENT forum meetings at the Queen Elizabeth Hospital, Birmingham.

I have attended a Management Development Course (run by Arcardia Associates, Birmingham) which gave me an enormous insight as to the importance of doctors taking an active interest in management and for the need for a close collaboration between doctors and hospital management.

As a consultant at Eastbourne and Conquest Hospitals, my managerial responsibilities included at various times.

- 1 Chairman of the combined ENT department at Eastbourne and Conquest Hospitals;
- 2 Chairman of the Eastbourne ENT department;
- 3 Lead clinician of head and neck cancer surgery at Eastbourne and Conquest Hospitals.
4. Lead for Clinical Governance for the Trust.

I am responsible for the work and training of five junior doctors, including one associate specialist, two staff grades and two SHOs.

## RESEARCH EXPERIENCE

I have instigated and participated in several research projects throughout my ENT career. In a clinicopathological study at Liverpool University, under the direction of Professor Stell, I investigated the presence of free squamous cell carcinoma in the soft tissue of the neck and its influence on the survival of patients with head and neck cancer. It involved the review of histological slides from neck dissections of 500 patients. The results were presented at the 1994 meeting of the Association of Head and Neck Oncologists of Great Britain and also published by the Journal of Clinical Otolaryngology.

In a clinical study, using graduated endotracheal tubes, I measured the size of the posterior choana in children and compared it with the size of the subglottis (by recording the size of the endotracheal tube in the anaesthetised child). This showed that the two sizes are directly comparable in the same child. This, I believe, will greatly facilitate the assessment of children with subglottic stenosis or choanal stenosis. The above study led to further research on the posterior choana. Using MRI/CT scans of 200 patients and via computer measurements, I have defined the normal size (area, height and width) of the posterior choana in adults. I have shown that a deviated nasal septum does not influence the size of the posterior choana and also compared the anatomical and functional area of the posterior choana in adults. This work led to three presentations (European Rhinology Society) and three forthcoming publications.

Other completed projects include the comparison of Cocaine and Lignocaine as Local Anaesthetics in the Nose (published by the JLO), the Effect of Topical Bupivacaine on Post-tonsillectomy Pain (published by the JLO), a Radiological Study on Incidental Paranasal Sinus Inflammatory Changes in a British Population (accepted for publication by the JLO) and an Epidemiological Study on 1000 patients with laryngeal cancer (in collaboration with the West Midlands Cancer Registree).

Retrospective studies include the use of prophylactic antibiotics and post-laryngectomy pharyngocutaneous fistulae (presented at the RSM, published by the JLO), Middle Ear Cleft Obliteration (also published by the JLO), Oral and Oropharyngeal Malignancies and Early Diagnosis (published by the Practitioner), Orbital Complications of Sinusitis and the Need for Active Management (presented at the European Rhinology Society).

A scoring system for children with secretory otitis media was developed, which hopefully will make the assessment of these children a lot more objective. In a separate study, I also investigated the association between low serum immunoglobulins and the presence of secretory otitis media in children (up to date 160 children have been investigated).

More recently, I have published a paper on ultrasound guided cutting/needle biopsy of parotid tumours. This allows the histological identification of parotid tumours, prior to any surgical treatment. On another study, we have evaluated parotid tumours, using high resolution ultrasound. At present we are working on developing a model of human airway for drug permeability studies. This is done in conjunction with the pharmacology department at the University of Brighton.

## **TEACHING EXPERIENCE**

Throughout my career as a registrar, senior registrar and consultant, I have been involved in the teaching of medical students, both formally, with lectures, and informally within the clinical setting and small tutorials. I have given lectures to such diverse groups as general practitioners, speech therapists, casualty officers and ENT course nurses.

I have a particular interest in the surgical training of ENT trainees, and I greatly enjoy taking junior doctors, registrars and SHOs through surgical procedures.

## **MEDICO-LEGAL EXPERIENCE**

During my career as a Consultant in ENT surgery, I have been asked to produce numerous medical legal reports (at least 15 per year) both on industrial injuries to the ear, nose or throat as well as after medical mishap. The ratio of instructions received is usually sixty percent claimant and forty percent defendant.
